

ORDINANCE NO. 4741

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING BEAVERTON CODE SECTION  
2.08.030 RELATING TO THE TIMING OF INVENTORY OF  
PERSONS IN CUSTODY**

**Whereas**, administrative searches must be approved by a politically accountable body and must limit the discretion of officials conducting the searches;

**Whereas**, BPD police officers conduct administrative searches after taking people into custody to prevent the City from getting into disputes about lost, stolen, or damaged property; and

**Whereas**, BPD police officers have noted instances on which the ordinance should be modified to minimize risks to their safety.

Now, therefore,

**THE CITY OF BEAVERTON ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** Beaverton Code Section 2.08.030 is amended to read as follows:

**2.08.030 Timing of Inventory.**

A. Except for the preliminary safety inspection or the inventory described in subsections B, C, D, or E of this section, an officer shall inventory personal property of a person in custody after the person is within the police station and before the person is released or transported to another law enforcement agency, or to a facility.

B. If the officer is transporting the person in custody directly to another law enforcement agency or to a facility, then the officer shall conduct the inventory before that person is transported to the law enforcement agency or facility.

C. If an officer is transporting the person in custody directly to a facility for treatment of intoxication pursuant to ORS Chapter 430, then the officer shall conduct the inventory before that person is transported to the facility.

D. If a person in custody is transported directly to a facility because of a mental health hold pursuant to ORS Chapter 426, and the officer retains the personal property of that person, then the officer shall conduct the inventory before that person is transported to the facility.


E. If exigent circumstances or safety concerns reasonably require that the inventories from subsections A through D of this section be delayed, the officer shall conduct the inventory as soon as practicable after the exigency or safety concern has passed.


