

ORDINANCE NO. 4747

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING BEAVERTON CODE CHAPTER 1
BY CREATING CHAPTER 1.08 RELATING TO THE SECURITY
OF THE MUNICIPAL COURT AND AUTHORIZING THE
PRESIDING JUDGE TO ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN
ADMINISTRATIVE SEARCH PROCEDURES, AND DECLARING
AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, security in the City's local court facility is of paramount importance to the City;
and

Whereas, there have been previously documented threats made against Beaverton Municipal Judges, which have created a risk to employees and the public in the Griffith Building. By their very nature, a local court facility can often be a place of extreme emotion and create a safety risk to staff, judges and the public; and

Whereas, the City Council deems it necessary and appropriate to provide reasonable safeguards for the security of personnel and residents and visitors who conduct business within the building that contains its local court facility to discourage and prevent dangerous behaviors occurring within the building that contains its local court facilities; and

Whereas, state law permits a politically accountable body such as a city council to authorize administrative searches in certain situations for a purpose other than the enforcement of laws by means of criminal sanctions; and

Whereas, the City Council desires to permit its presiding judge to institute administrative searches within the building that contains its local court facility to provide reasonable safeguards for the security of personnel and residents and visitors who conduct business within the building that contains its local court facility; and

Whereas, the City desires to declare an emergency so that the City may more quickly protect the safety of its residents, visitors, staff, and judges and mitigate any risks that may occur from future threats made against its judges.

Now, therefore,

THE CITY OF BEAVERTON ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Beaverton Code Chapter 1 is amended by creating Chapter 1.08 relating to Municipal Court, which reads as follows:

1.08.005 Definitions

Local court facility – The portion of the building in which the City's municipal court conducts business, during the hours in which the court operates.

1.08.010 Delegation of Authority to Presiding Judge

The presiding judge of the Beaverton Municipal Court may:

- A. Define which items and weapons are prohibited from the local court facility; and
- B. Establish and maintain procedures to conduct administrative searches for prohibited items and weapons before entry into the local court facility.

Section 2. This ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance takes effect on its passage.

Second reading and passage by this Council this 4th day of December, 2018.
